



“Independence Day 2016 – What every Indian can do for Swachh Bharat”

(Collective Inputs from 350,000 strong Swachh Bharat Circle)

1. Get together with neighbours in the morning for Flag Hoisting or otherwise
2. Ensure all from household participate in the neighbourhood meeting, esp. children
3. Plant a tree if feasible for making the neighbourhood greener
4. Conduct a cleanliness drive or “shraam daan” if feasible
5. Have a discussion on cleanliness of the neighbourhood
6. Discuss how the following can be improved
 - a. Civic Sense
 - b. Garbage Collection
 - c. Waste Segregation
 - d. Waste Disposal
 - e. Recycling Opportunities
 - f. Water Supply
 - g. Installation and Maintenance of public toilets in the area
 - h. Defacement of property
 - i. Rules and implementation for plastic, hazardous, electronic and C&D waste disposal
 - j. Interface with municipal workers/supervisors for the area
 - k. Fogging and Pest Control
7. Decide if a joint meeting is to be held with corporator, municipal councillor, others
8. Address any RWA, household staff on the rules, esp. on Civic Sense matters
9. Plan if neighbourhood civic sense rules are to be posted in public places
10. Lay out a schedule of monthly neighbourhood meeting on cleanliness
11. Enjoy snacks together and strengthen the community bond.
